An Unhealthy Soul

- A Healthy Soul Produces:

- An Unhealthy Soul Produces:
 - Hatred, Discord, Jealousy, Selfish
 Ambition, Fits of Rage, Envy

Sin Destroys Us

Romans 6:16

Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one you obey—whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness?

Sin is Death Now

Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Why do we sin?

- But Jesus forgave our sins, right?
- Sin remains because we choose it
 - Sin deceives us
 - We believe Sin's promises
 - We believe our way is better than God's
- Sin traps and enslaves us with its lies

What hope is there?

Romans 5:10

For if, while we were still God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life.

Our Hope is Jesus

- Jesus death' forgave our sins wiped away the punishment of eternal death later
 - Reconciled us = Opened a pathway to relationship with God the Father
- His LIFE IN YOU = the way out of sin
 - God heals our souls!
