Acts 15: The Church at a Crossroads

- Jesus-followers were Jewish
- Gentiles started following Jesus
- Judaizers insisted that Gentile Christians be circumcised
- Paul vehemently disagreed
- The Antioch church sent Paul and Barnabas to Jerusalem



What Question Did They Need to Answer?

- Surface: Do you have to become a Jew to become a Christian?
- Deeper: What will the future of the Christian movement look like?
- Strong arguments on both sides



Tradition and Caution

- Gentile converts to Judaism had always been circumcised
- Pharisees: Purity is necessary to maintain God's favor
- Jews were excused from emperor worship

Paul's Argument: Trust Jesus

How Did They Decide?

- They sought Holy Spirit's guidance
- They remembered Peter and Cornelius
- They remembered God's plan in Scripture



How Did They Decide?

- They remembered Jesus' parting words:
 - "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere-- in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8 NLT)
- They agreed that Jesus didn't die for nothing "We believe that we are all saved the same way, by the undeserved grace of the Lord Jesus."

 (Acts 15:11 NLT)

The Letter to Gentile Believers

²⁸ "For it seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to lay no greater burden on you than these few requirements:..." (Acts 15:28 NLT)
