# Philippians 3:1-11

Finally, my brothers, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you is no trouble to me and is safe for you.<sup>2</sup> Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh.<sup>3</sup> For we are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh--<sup>4</sup> though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more:<sup>5</sup> circumcised on the eighth day,

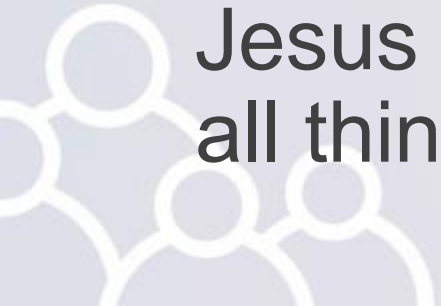

# What Paul Chose to Lose

# Knowing Christ and Being Transformed

- Paul considered everything he had accomplished as garbage
- He invited God's total renovation of his heart, his mind, his life
- In Jesus there is no loss without transformation



# Knowing Christ and Being Transformed

We are the kind of losers who *choose* to lose everything in order to know Jesus



# Steps to Take When Experiencing Transforming Losses

- Notice when you're feeling unsettled
- Understand that you may be experiencing your false self
- Understand how your false self is holding you back
- Understand that fear, anger, pride, or stubbornness signals the death of part of something that *used to be* important
- Remember what Jesus said...



# What Jesus Said

"If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. <sup>25</sup> For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. (Matthew 16:24-25 ESV)



# Steps to Take When in Transforming Loss

- Notice when you're feeling unsettled
- Understand that you may be experiencing your false self
- Understand how your false self is holding you back
- Understand that fear, anger, pride, or stubbornness signals the death of part of something that *used to be* important
- Remember what Jesus said...
- Discard garbage, choose to follow Jesus



# When All You Can See Is the Loss

Remember:

- God created us to enjoy deep and eternal relationship with him.
- God loves and cares for us and he will never stop.
- In Jesus, there is no death without resurrection, no loss without transformation





# Bible Study Tip

Don't focus on or become obsessed with what you don't know, rather remember and cling to what you do know



# Invitation

1. Find a place where you can sit alone with God.
2. Ask God to show you how he's working in your life and what losses will ensue. Or remember a time in the past when you lost a part of your false self.
3. Ponder those losses. Pay attention to them. Feel them. See how important they are—and then choose to lose your plans, your dreams, your security, your safety.
4. Ask God to give you a glimpse of the new you he's creating, of the joy that is to come when you see how God is transforming you.
5. Say goodbye to what you're losing and thank God for what new things he's building in you.
